## Seeking foster care for homeless pets

**WALNUT CREEK, CA**—May 7, 2018—Pets bring joy and comfort, as well as better health, to their owners' lives, but financial or medical problems can leave pet owners scrambling to hold onto pets while they seek help. Foster care needs range from one to two days and/or nights up to a few weeks. Pets are screened for health, hygiene, and behavior.

We also need **veterinary care assistance** in the form of exams and vaccinations, and **pet food assistance**. Homeless pets often eat human food that is not healthy for them, so pet food for hungry pets is in great need.
